What's Happening at RB Community Church

Thank you...

for helping to make 2018 a year of blessings to our community. Through the RB Community Church Ministry for Missions, you supported hands-on events providing hygiene kits and underwear to the homeless, hundreds of cans of food to local pantries, backpacks and school supplies that were distributed in San Diego and in Baja California, served meals to families in transition, and helped to build homes for Habitat for Humanity.

Additionally, you raised funds for and participated in a food-packing event, resulting in 50,000 meals for hungry families, and provided 39 gallons of blood for the San Diego Blood Bank. LifeGroups and families teamed up to deliver 80 Thanksgiving Dinner Bags to local families, and our Angel Tree provided Christmas toys for children of parents serving in the military. We couldn't do it without *you!*

THANK YOU to everyone that helped with donations to meet the \$50,000 Mission Challenge. You can be assured that these funds will be used to support our local and international missions who are serving in the mission field as the hands and feet of Christ on our behalf. These donations were an added blessing to our mission efforts. The Ministry for Missions already has opportunities on the calendar for you to participate in and continue our hands-on efforts to serve those in our community. For *Play It Forward*, we are collecting gently used toys for children served through Presbyterian Urban Ministries (PUM), Salvation Army in Escondido, and Door of Faith Orphanage in Mexico.

The "Souper" Bowl of Caring event starts mid-January through February 3. We are collecting cans and boxes of food items for PUM and Interfaith Community Services in Escondido. Watch in the gallery as our youth and Boy Scouts create artistic "can-struction" displays.
